Ausdruck	Bedeutung	Beispiel
To have a (good) nose for something	Einen Talent dafür haben, etwas zu finden oder zu erkennen	I got these jeans for 50% less – I've always had a good nose for a bargain.
To poke your nose in	Sich einmischen	I wanted to keep this a secret, but she's always poking her nose in where it's not wanted.
To follow your nose	Der Nase nach gehen ODER Deinen Instinkten folgen	Just follow your nose and you'll see the bathroom on your right. This is a new way of working for me; I'm just following my nose.
To be nosy	(Zu) neugierig sein	He's really nosy – he wants to know all the details of my personal life.
Hard-nosed	Knallhart, kompromisslos	She's a hard-nosed negotiator, but in the end we came to an agreement.
To have a nose around	Sich umschaun, oft um etwas zu finden	Have a nose around in my wardrobe – there'll probably be a few shirts that fit you.
To look down your nose at someone	Auf jemanden herabblicken	She came from a rich family and I always felt that she was looking down her nose at me.
To get up someone's nose	Jemanden nerven	It really gets up my nose when people put apostrophes in the wrong place.
